THE GLORY OF WESTERN ENGINE

During the early 1900's, California experienced huge growth thanks to the citrus industry. Often referred to as the second Gold Rush, California's citrus industry was heavily influenced by the industrial revolution.

The use of large mechanical machines supported groves and communities around California. Thanks to dedicated volunteers, one of these impressive machines has been restored and housed at the California Citrus State Historic Park.

This impressive machine, manufactured by the Western Engine Company of Los Angeles, was accompanied by a sister engine in the original pump house. Together, they would distribute millions of gallons of water throughout the groves and surrounding towns.

The machines ran 24 hours a day from April to September. Built in 1926, the engines were fitted with large 7 foot diameter flywheels that provided power through flat belts to turn large centrifugal pumps. These pumps would lift the water to elevated reservoirs throughout the area and flowed by gravity to the groves.

Today, the California Citrus Park houses the Western Engine as a historical piece of the Citrus Industry, reminding visitors of the grand machines that helped nurture and grow the entire state.

For the last seven years, the Western Engine Restoration Team (WERT), comprised of Ron Haskell, Dutch Bankston, Jim Treadwell, Kim Hammel and Dick Bouma, have given the Western Engine the glory it deserves by completely restoring the engine and building a period correct display in the park.

Surrounded by wooden walls and antiques that were generously donated, the Western Engine now has a wonderful home.

With the support of the Friends and State Parks, the Western Engine's development team continues to make improvements and maintain this amazing engine, in order to share and educate about the wonders of the machine.

With the goal of constructing a bridge to make the engine more accessible, Haskell hopes that soon enough, the team will be able to hold tours twice a month. Visitors will be able to see the Western Engine run and learn about the engine's history and significance to the state. Fun Facts: The engine weighs 32,000 pounds and produces 200 horsepower!

LOOKING FORWARD



After the economic crash in the early 2000's, California Citrus State Historic Park was only onethird completed. The dreams and goals of a complete and welcoming historic park were postponed because of the recession.

A primary focus of the Friends is to ensure the full build out of the Park. The top three projects are landscaping the Concourse Area, construction of a historic Grower's Residence (illustration above), and construction of a bridge across the arroyo that connects the Park and the Western Engine. The Friends have raised and committed \$400,000 towards these improvements and are actively seeking additional funding through grants, donations and partnerships.

To this end, a Fundraising Committee has recently been formed to help us engage donors to be part of this effort.

NOTE FROM KELLY ELLIOTT, INLAND EMPIRE SUPERINTENDENT CA CITRUS STATE HISTORIC PARK

The CA Citrus State Historic Park has been in partnership with the Friends of CA Citrus Park, formally known as the Non-Profit Management Corporation, from the Park's inception.

The partnership between State Parks and the Friends was particularly active the past two years. Some highlights include:

- **Tag Hunts** This interpretive trail system guides visitors through the park with engaging, educational information about the history of and fun facts about citrus.
- Western Engine Beyond the financial support for the restoration, the Friends also hosted a fundraiser that not only raised dollars for further improvements, but also raised awareness of this amazing resource and educational exhibit.
- Varietal groves- The park boasts 2 separate varietal groves for public enjoyment with over 100 varieties of citrus trees. An Operating Agreement between the Friends and State Parks provides ongoing maintenance of the varietal groves and management of the commercial grove lease.
- School bus funding- The Friends have also supported the Interpretive and Educational efforts of the park by providing school bus funding for elementary school children to visit the park. School tours bring almost 2,500 students each year to the park for a guided tour which include a hike through the varietal groves and citrus tasting. Tours are designed by the State Parks interpretive staff and conducted by staff and volunteers.

With the donations received and revenues generated, the Friends have invested over \$225,000 into the Park over the last four years!





2020 IMPROVEMENTS

While the Visitor's Center, Museum and Gift Shop have been closed for much of the year, we are so thankful that the Park has been available to the public for outdoor recreation and to support individual health and well being!

It has been a welcomed haven for visitors to get out and even connect in a socially safe way.

The Friends decided to make the most of the situation and took this time to give the Gift Shop an interior facelift and repainted the Picnic Shelter, Amphitheater, gazebo and benches around the gazebo.
